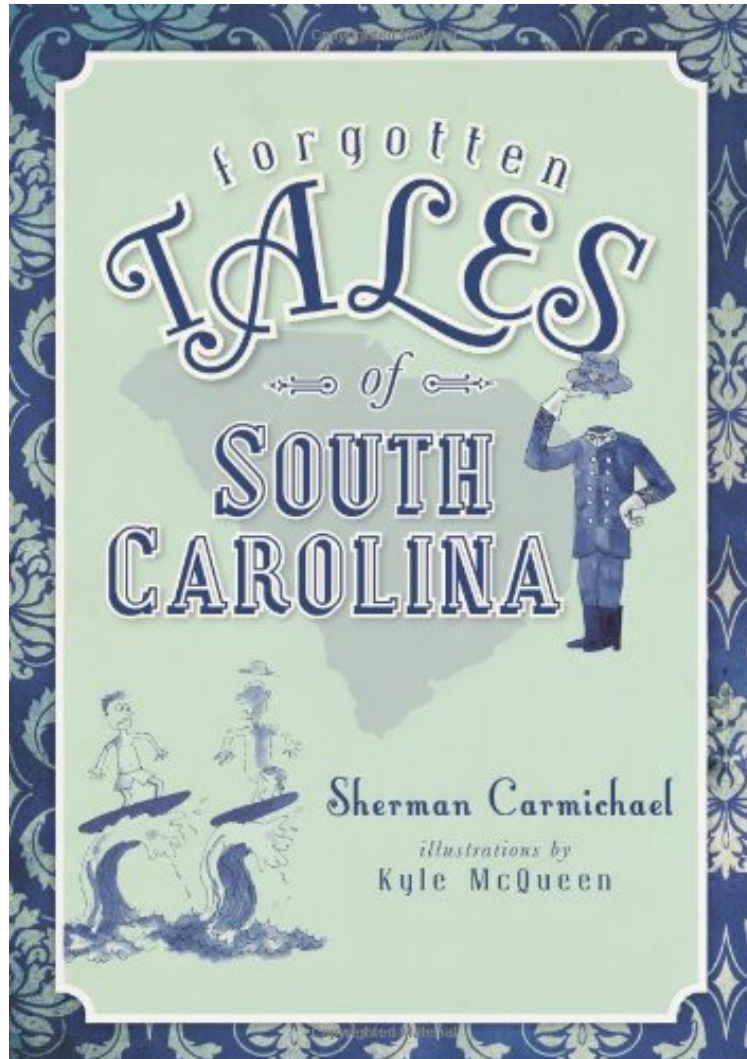

Carmichael details numerous accounts histories of strange occurrences, some of them squarely paranormal and others plain unusual like the unarmed nuclear bomb that exploded in South Carolina in 1958. Carmichael's account of this tale is short -- like everything in this book -- but riveting, bringing to mind the movie Dr. Strangelove with the bombardier pulling himself back into the plane just as the bomb falls to the ground. The story of the female pirate Anne Bonny contains the seed for a great screenplay! The Boo Hag legend is as creepy as any voodoo could be.

Accounts of ghosts, UFO's, strange atmospheric conditions and phantom hitchhikers abound. Carmichael presents these tales with the exacting eye of a nonfiction researcher, giving us the news, however strange. My only criticism is that this is the type of book that begs for an index so one can quickly find geographical references, people and particular spirits at a glance. This is a delightful read, one sure to thrill those who seek evidence of a little magic in this world! Enjoy!

Forgotten Tales of South Carolina is an excellent compendium of lore from around the state. The stories cover a wide range of topics, from spectral lights to UFOs to Big Foot and more. The only problem is that the material could stand some editing. In some places the stories were repeated unnecessarily, and there appears to be no organizational strategy to the book.

From the desk of Sherman Carmichael comes a collection of about a hundred quirky and unpublished tales from the Palmetto State. Tales include everything from folk tales, urban legends, monsters, mermaids, ghost sightings, mysterious lights, UFO sightings, dinosaurs, and haunted locations.
