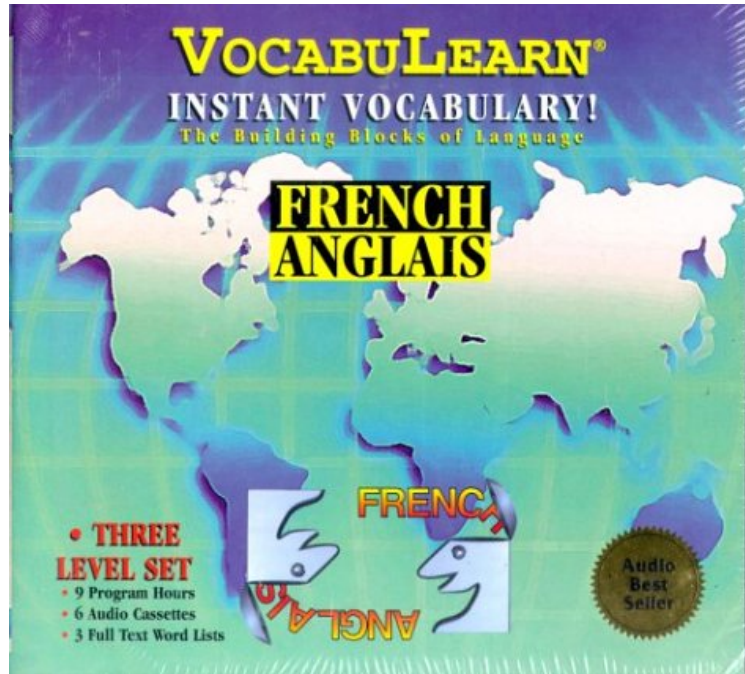

I purchased the less expensive cassette tape version of this program, and I've definitely been getting my money's worth out of it. This program is basically an audio version of flash cards, but also includes full sentences rather than just individual lexical items.. There is no "narrator" as such, just a native English speaker and a native French speaker who read vocabulary items and expressions. They switch back and forth between English - French and French - English. Each of the three levels has two cassettes with a transcription booklet. The first cassette reviews individual lexical items from the various parts of speech except verbs, and the second cassette goes over verbs and various expressions. I have other audio programs which focus on grammar and fluid speaking practice, and this series of cassettes provides a nice supplement to give one more word power. (Regarding the former, I recommend in particular the older version of Living Language "French: the Basics," which is extremely well structured and provides good all-around coverage of the language, both on the CDs and in the accompanying books - which include a few cultural notes as well. I also have their "Beyond the Basics" CDs, but am currently building up to that level.) 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. By A Customer I am just now finishing the older (no music) version. This is an honest "get-what-they-promise" product. An American man says the word or phrase in English; a Frenchwoman says it in French. There is a good progression of complexity between levels. I used this course everyday commuting to and from work. That's 2

hours a day, 5 days per week. It took me two weeks to more-or-less master a single tape. That's one month per level. I started to understand more of the French in the TV movies I taped. Now, I often recognize words learned in this course. I recommend it. But you must expect to work.
