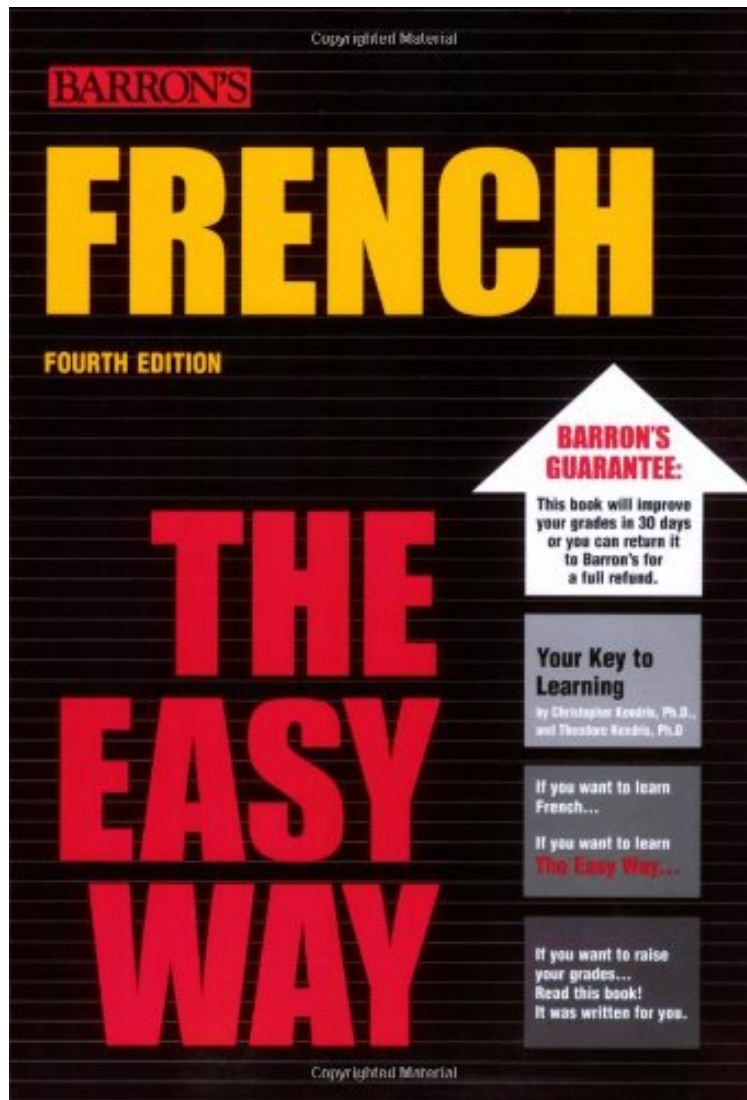

I love this bookBy DingoI am currently on a mad dash to learn French, and I have been using this book, and a few other, and several other listening methods. I know I am supposed to hear it first, and then learn the grammar, but for me, I want to learn it all. So, I have this book next to my bed, and am almost half way through with it. When I first started, I knew almost nothing, now I am starting to recognize patterns, and words, and sounds. This book is very easy, and gives lots of practice and examples, and has a great glossary in

both French/English, and English/French. It also has many of the verb conjugations in the back. One thing I have learned about learning another language is that it is not easy, there is no magic solution, but repetition, and exposing yourself to it over and over, even when you don't understand. I watch French movies with English subtitles, listen to French songs. I also own an old version of Living Language with the books and CDs, which is good. My favorite tools are hands-down Assimil and the internet program called Frantastique. This is frustratingly difficult and I simply gave up. Until it starts publishing books that are written specifically for kindle, with internal hyperlinks, instead of taking the lazy way and just scanning paper books and selling them for kindle, I would not recommend language books for kindle (or any other kind of book in which the reader needs to move from one part of the book to another). I have been using the book for about 6 weeks. This book does a good job of teaching French vocabulary and grammar. If all you are looking for is the ability to read and understand simple French writings - then this book is a good fit for you. But there is absolutely nothing in this book on pronunciation. The only reason I am OK is that my French teacher has made a CD for this textbook which she has distributed where she reads the lessons and instructs on French pronunciation. By the way - my first impression of French pronunciation is that it is most definitely not obvious and intuitive. You need someone with you to explain and instruct you on the rules of pronunciation.
