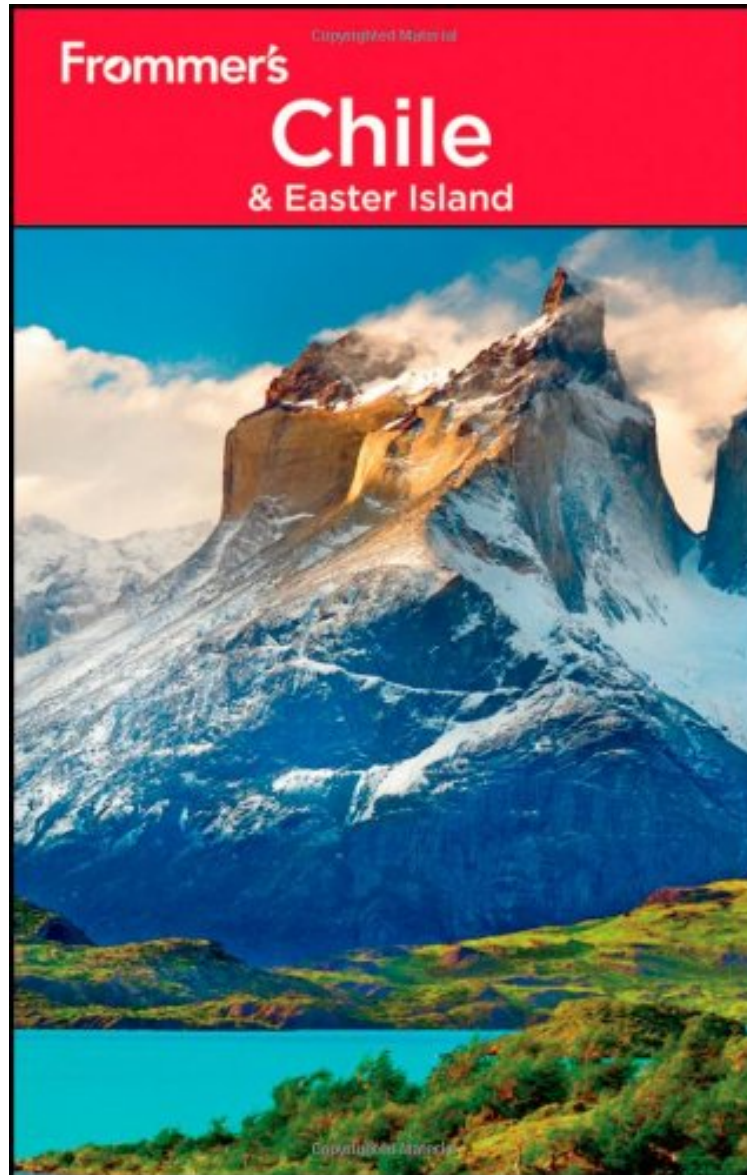

\$100/night in Chile (lodging for two), this is not the guide book for you. Most towns have few, or no options for inexpensive lodging listed. The restaurant guide also seems to lean toward the expensive side. The maps and general information about cities and activities are ok, but sometimes a little slim (For instance, couldn't find a section about Concepcion, one of the largest cities in Chile. Also couldn't always find helpful info like the location of local laundry services). I've always bought Lonely Planet guide books before this. I only bought this guidebook because it was more recently updated than the LP Chile guide.
