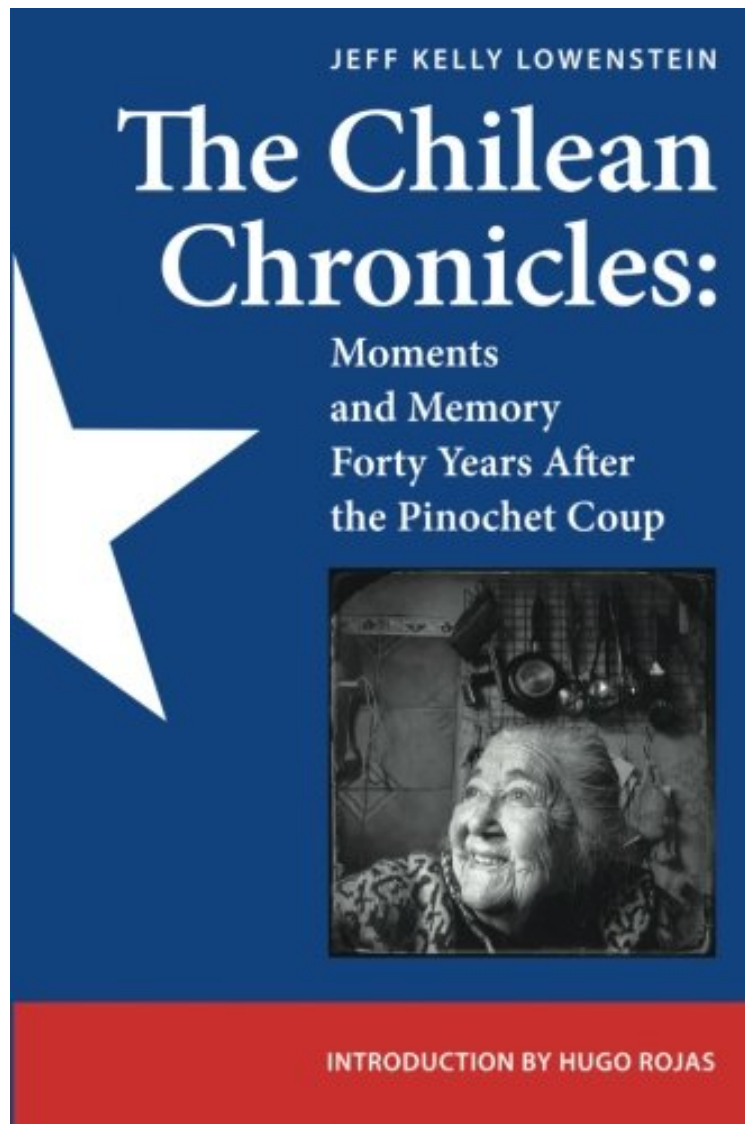

The Chilean Chronicles: Moments and Memory Forty Years After The Pinochet Coup is a selection of Jeff Kelly Lowensteins writing during his semester as a Fulbright Scholar at the University Diego Portales in Santiago. Written during a consequential period in Chilean history, the work brings together Kelly Lowensteins writings on the unprecedented eruption of memory before the fortieth anniversary of the overthrow of the democratically-elected Allende government, his experience teaching the nations first semester-long Data Journalism class, his travels throughout the country, and the many people he encountered along the way. Alternating between humor and sober reflection, *Chilean Chronicles* tackles the impact of historys painful legacies on daily life in a still-emerging democracy while recounting stories that would otherwise go untold.

About the Author Jeff Kelly Lowenstein is an assistant professor of Journalism at Grand Valley State University, the former database and investigative editor at Hoy Chicago, the Chicago Tribune companys Spanish-language newspaper, and past president of the Ochberg Society for Trauma Journalism, an international organization of journalists who cover issues of trauma and violence with sensitivity and compassion. His work has been published in *The New Yorker* and the Center for Public Integrity, among many publications, and has earned awards from organizations like the Investigative Reporters and Editors, the National Press Club, the Society for News Design and the National Association of Black Journalists. Jeff has participated in national and international fellowships about racial justice, the environment, health and trauma. In 1995 he was a Fulbright Teacher at the Uthongathi School in Tongaat, South Africa. In 2013 he was a Fulbright Scholar the University Diego Portales in Santiago, Chile and in 2015 he was a Fulbright Specialist at two universities in New Zealand. *The Chilean Chronicles* is his fourth book. Jeff blogs for the Huffington Post and lives in Grand Rapids, Michigan with his wife Dunreith. Their son Aidan lives in San Francisco.
