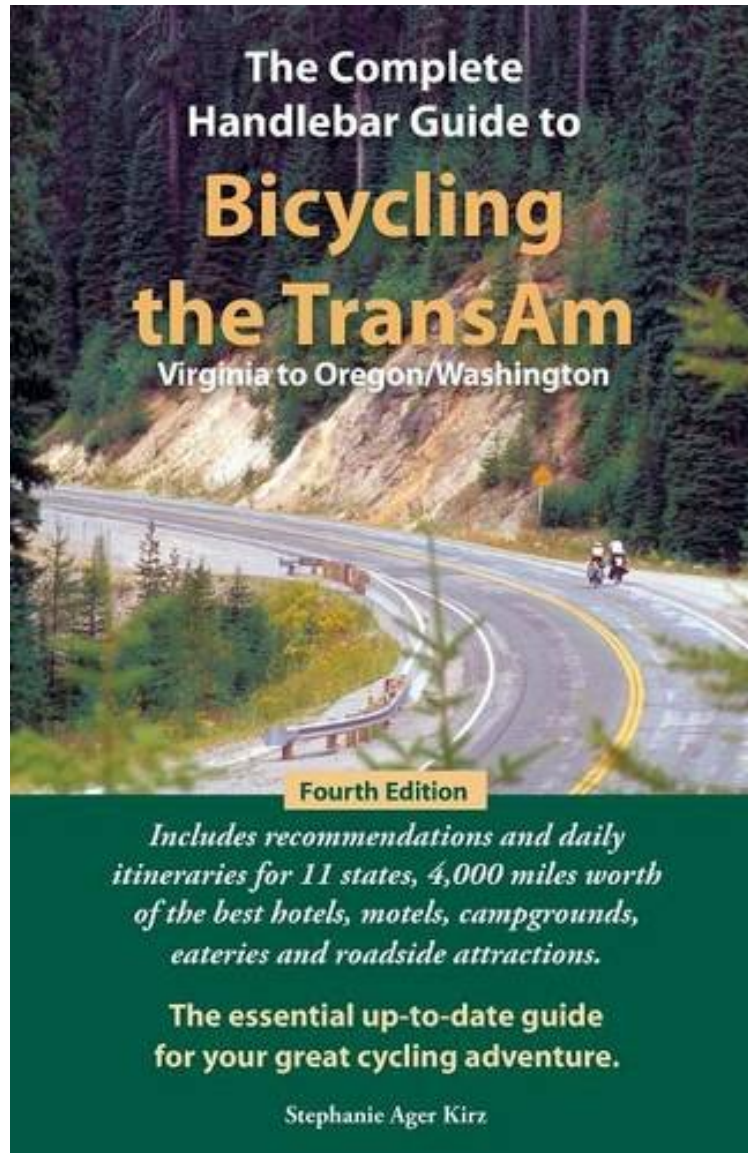

useful going east to west; unfortunately I'm going west to east. Use Google maps directions webpage, specifying going by bicycle, to get gross elevation up and down for each daily segment. You will then want to plan different daily destinations in many cases rendering info in the book marginally useful at best for west to east travel. For example, the book suggests going from Canon City, CO to Guffey, CO in one day; mileage 32.5; elevation gain 4,300 feet (Google directions show 4131 elevation gain and 810 elevation loss); that makes sense going east to west. However, going west to east this would be a short, easy day almost all downhill. Going from Guffey to Pueblo, CO is about 75 miles mostly downhill which makes more sense to me for one day route rather than taking two days to do it. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. And even a poor editing job when there's a note saying "Stephanie, insert a restaurant here from the yellow pages" (not exact wording, but you get the gist) I just didn't think this was a particularly useful book, and certainly not for someone looking for lots of information. Just the basics. Disappointing.
