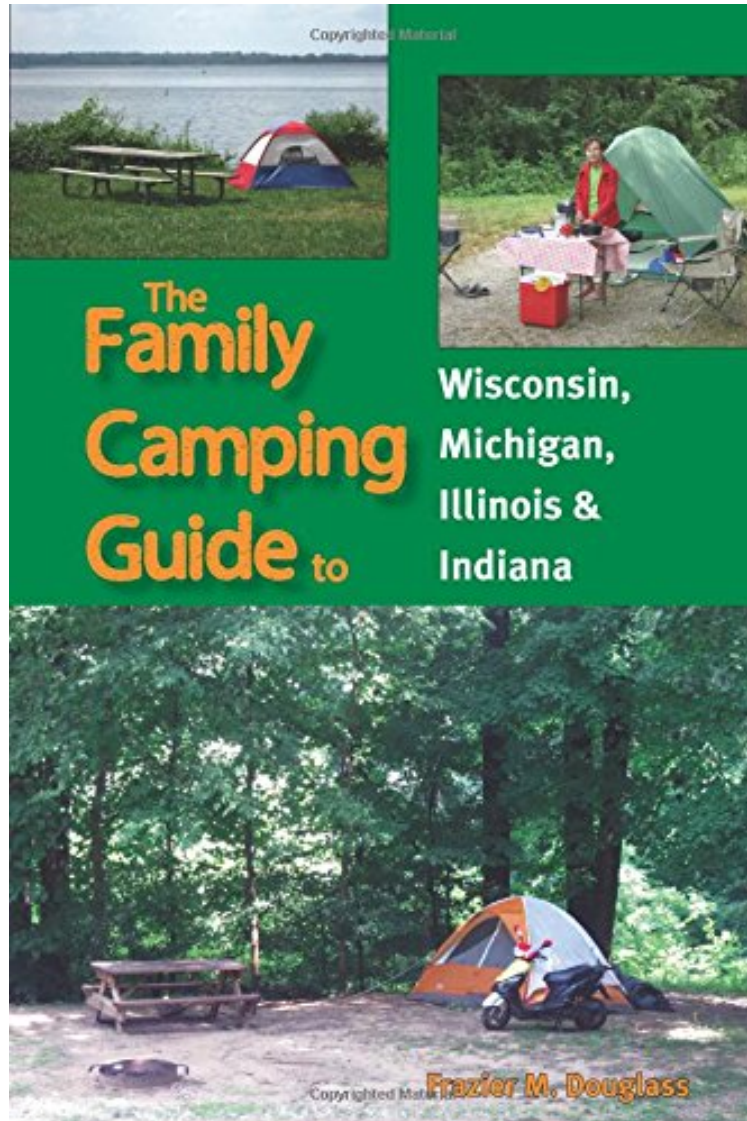

Currently, he is retired and spends most of his time teaching a few graduate psychology courses at Alabama A M University, camping, and writing books about camping. Although he was a teacher by profession, he is an engineer at heart and enjoys devising solutions to common camping problems. Douglass began camping with his father when he was ten years old and has camped throughout the southeastern, midwestern, and western United States. His favorite camping destinations are Door County, Wisconsin; Michigan's western shoreline; southern Indiana; Rend Lake, Illinois; the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, Helen, Georgia; and the Florida Gulf Coast. In the mid 1990s, he served three summers as the campground host at Brigham County Park near Madison, Wisconsin. In 2011, he and his wife began taking two- and three-week-long campground touring trips through Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, and Indiana. Typically, these trips departed from north Alabama starting with a series of overnight camps in Indiana, Illinois, or southern Wisconsin, established a week-long base camp in Door County, Wisconsin, and culminated with a series of overnight camps in Michigan and Indiana on the way back home. Each year, he tries to visit at least ten new campgrounds in the four Lake Michigan states and experience more of the many attractions scattered around the region.
